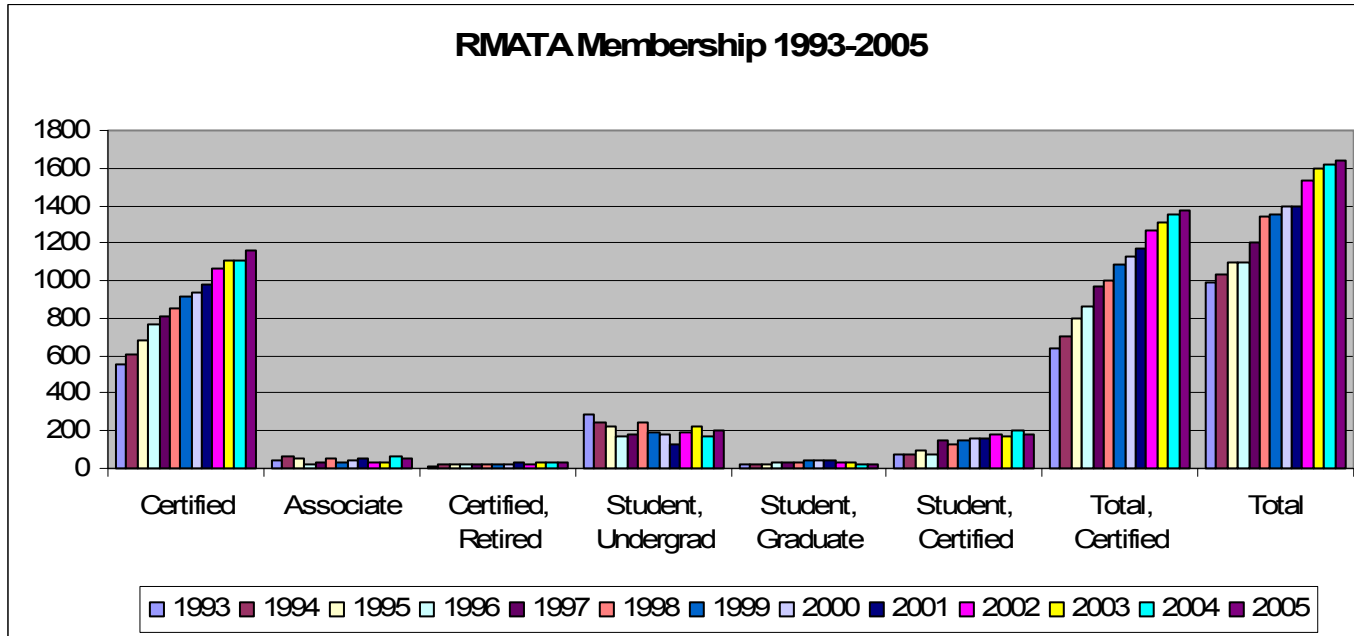

Membership notes:

1. Membership statistics presented each March are the latest provided by the NATA. Changes that seem out of the ordinary may be due to the timeliness of the data provided by the NATA. Both the 1996 and 2001 numbers are suspect. March is used because we have data from earlier years to use as a comparison.
2. Members should be reminded that all membership lists (address, e-mail, etc.) originate with the NATA National Office. The RMATA gets membership data from the NATA and the state associations get their membership data from the RMATA. All changes need to be made with the NATA National Office. District or state officers cannot change a members address, e-mail, phone, etc., this must be done by the member through the National Office. Changes may be made in the following ways:
 - A. On the Internet: Members log into the NATA “Members Only” web site and click on “Address Changes”

3. Members should also change their address with the NATA-BOC. The NATA and the NATA-BOC do coordinate address databases but there is a time lag.
4. Members use their member number and Social Security number to log into the “Members Only” section of the NATA web site. If anyone objects to using their Social Security number may contact Sandy Ward at the NATA National Office and change it to any 9 digit number.
